


# **Research & Publications**

#### YouthPower2: Learning and Evaluation

GSDI is part of a consortium, led by Making Cents International, that was awarded the YouthPower2: Learning and Evaluation (YP2LE) grant. The grant is designed to support USAID's Youth in Development Policy by enabling investments in Positive Youth Development (PYD) research and evaluation within and across multiple sectors.

As part of the consortium, Dr's Chowa, Masa, Bilotta and Ms. Manzanares recently concluded their work on <u>"A Systematic Literature Review of Positive Youth Development Impacts on Marginalized and Vulnerable Youth."</u>





## Siyakha Youth Assets Research Briefs

Siyakha Youth Assets was a longitudinal, cluster-randomized study implemented in South Africa between 2015 and 2019. Siyakha's primary research objective was to examine the causal impacts of youth employment and financial inclusion programs on financial capabilities, employability, and longer-term employment effects for South African youth. The study was conducted by the Global Social Development Innovations at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and the Centre for Social

Development in Africa at the University of Johannesburg, in partnership with eight organizations providing youth employability programs in South Africa.
